### **Online Safety**



There has been a lot of activity on social media this week regarding the Momo challenge. Whilst this appears to be a meme that has gone viral and created a lot of hysteria it reminds us of the need to ensure our children know how to keep themselves safe online.

Many young people have access to a number of messaging services (such as WhatsApp, Instagram, YouTube, Facebook Snapchat and through online gaming). We will, this month, be speaking to our pupils about staying safe online. Our **Key Stage 2 pupils** will be shown a video, aimed at 8-10 year olds, created by the Child Exploitation Online Protection Centre (CEOP) that discusses the importance of having appropriate security settings on social media sites, minimising online contact details and thinking about what personal photos appear online. In the meantime, we would warmly advise parents to view <a href="https://www.thinkuknow.co.uk/">https://www.thinkuknow.co.uk/</a> with your child. The website offers training to help children learn how to:

- Distinguish between safe and unsafe behaviours online
- Feel more confident to seek help from a trusted adult when they need it
- Understand how they can use the Thinkuknow 8-10s website to seek advice and support on staying safe online

The informative website provides clear and practical safety advice in the following areas:

Play - playing games online

Like - being kind to others online

Share – sharing videos and photos online

Chat – talking to others online

Lock - keeping information private
