




During lockdown, my child has been able to access an internet connected device (e.g. Home computer / laptop / tablet / mobile phone) to complete online work









My child was more motivated and engaged by online learning tasks than the 'Home Learning' materials provided in packs







The videos where really helpful as they made sure I was teaching the correct way and not confusing my son and the feed back and praise from his teacher motivated him to do more


The volume of work provided during lockdown has been...








The difficulty of the work set during lockdown has been...












During lockdown, I received calls / voicemails / had a missed call(s) from school 15 responses








If 'Blended Learning' (a mixture of 'in-school' and 'home-school' learning) is required in August / September, I would prefer...
